Helen Timperley is Professor Emeritus at the University of Auckland. Throughout her teaching, leadership and research career she has focused on how educators can make a difference to important outcomes for learners. She has co-authored work on the Spiral of Inquiry with Linda Kaser and Judy Halbert as well as many other books and publications. She is currently co-writing two books on the facilitation and leadership of professional learning with research colleagues.

The focus of this seminar will be on how to make professional conversations count in terms of their impact. It is based on an extensive review of the international literature and Helen's work with district and school leaders and teachers. Professional conversations, together with the processes that accompany them, provide the oil for professional learning throughout the spiral of inquiry. The seminar will also address how these conversations can develop adaptive expertise that has proved so important when working with the uncertainty of complex educational problems needing transformative rather than routine change.
